"The King of Kong: A Fistful of Quarters" (2007)

Directed by Seth Gordon.

Starring Steve Wiebe, Billy Mitchell, and Walter Day as themselves.

Rated PG-13 for a brief sexual reference. 79 minutes, color.

What happens when a loser who needs to win faces a winner who refuses to lose? That question is posed in the preview trailer for this recent highly acclaimed and instantly beloved documentary film.

It is an apt description of the exceptional true-life drama that unfolds as an unknown upstart sets out to dethrone the reigning champion... of Donkey Kong. That's right – in the cutthroat, high-stakes world of competitive arcade gaming, passions flare, legacies rise and fall, and unforgettable individuals abound. Witness newcomer Steve Wiebe, a school teacher and family man, in his "Rocky"-like pursuit to go the distance and attain the all-time high score for the classic 1980s arcade game, Donkey Kong.

But the barrel-smashing action of the game itself is nothing compared to the actual challenge he must overcome – the impossibly coifed hot sauce mogul and longtime champion of Donkey Kong, Billy Mitchell. Stand back, true-believers!

Most scripted dramas would be thrilled to achieve the level of tension and classic conflict laid out on the table here. The real wonder of "The King of Kong: A Fistful of Quarters" is that it works its charms absolutely, whether the viewer cares one lick about video games or not. I've never owned a video game console in my life, and rarely parted with quarters in the arcade. Yet, this film stands as one of the most solidly entertaining documentaries in years. So give this a try – you will be glad you did! You will love this movie!!!

Perhaps the most important thing a Christian can do when it comes to their commending of Christ to a lost person is praying for that particular person. This is because no matter how bold, truthful, clear, humble, or loving we are in the presentation of the gospel of Jesus Christ to an unbeliever, they will certainly reject it as foolishness, unless our Father in heaven opens their heart, so that they might receive the gospel as God's word of grace for them. Jesus says in John 6:44 "No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws him" (John 6:44, ESV). Jesus words are an invitation for us to pray for lost people. If God has the ability to make stony and rebellious hearts receptive to the gospel then let us pray that He does so for the lost people we know.

My hope for this newsletter is that it will encourage you to rejoice with us while also giving you an opportunity to continue to participate in this unique work of missions. Recent Ministry and Outreach Opportunities

Our mission church exists to tell and apply the story of the gospel. We gather throughout the year at different times to network with our neighbors in central Queens to spread the fame of our Savior. Please pray for fruit from the following ministry opportunities:

Easter Sunday 2009 saw well over 400 attend both our service and EasterFest outreach in the public school where we meet. (We had over 125 men, women and children in our service and childrens' classes. That day we distributed a few hundred copies of a small book on the evidence for and meaning of Christ's Resurrection. That event was so well-publicized that NY1 cable news channel came and did a segment on the event. The following Sunday, the New York Daily News featured our church in their Faith in the City feature. The article included a quote from me on the meaning of the gospel.

Summer VBS Helped by Grace & Peace Fellowship (in St. Louis) and some missionaries from our denomination (PCA), we had the privilege of ministering to about 100 children during a week-long Bible camp which culminated in a week-ending evening assembly where we enjoyed the great opportunity to share Christ's love with 100 sets of parents and relatives.

Forest Hills Street Fair We set up tables and a tent at this twice-yearly event in October and hit the streets. Ascension volunteers distributed hundreds of pieces of literature, books and New Testaments while

engaging dozens in conversation. One such person we engaged was a Muslim man tending the Islam booth just next to ours.

Real people changed and challenged

Ascension has formed and will continue to form various community and learning groups in order to minister to seekers, prodigals and Christians of various levels of experience and maturity. These include groups ministering to married couples, singles, men, women, youth and mid-week co-ed Bible studies.

Your love expressed through the encouragement of words, prayer and financial donations enable us to reach more and more people while establishing a growing base of indigenous NYers glad with the worship of the Living God. The world Christ has told us to disciple is here in Queens! They are my neighbors. They live next door to me. They are the two Muslim families that have had us in their homes

- ◆ two families we rub shoulders with weekly, eager to have us back in their tiny Queens apartments to break bread. The world is the adults and children seeking meaning and darkening our doors on a regular basis. One is a Chinese-born ophthalmology student, another is a Brooklyn-bred, African-American banker. Another one is a middle-aged, female Sociology professor of Italian descent experiencing marital breakdown, who visited our church and found Christ's love.

Friends, the world is the two women on our block now in our new weekly discipleship cohort

- ◆ one from the Philippines, the other from Bulgaria, who, upon studying the Bible for two hours with me and Roseann, exclaimed an unknown word while we were studying the deity of Christ in Revelation 1. She went on to explain that the word from her dialect she used is best translated as the English Wow! Like our new Bulgarian friend, may we all experience afresh the Wow! of worship this Christmas season.

Opportunities and challenges ahead

We have an opportunity to finish 2009 in the black but we really need your help. December giving that is \$19,000 over our average monthly giving will allow us complete our financial obligations.

Going forward and looking ahead to 2010, we will need to raise an additional \$60,000 for the mission in order to meet expenses. Our mission is best described as a hybrid between cross-cultural missions and church planting. Because of the transitional nature of our demographic and high turnover (61 have moved in the past 12 months!) we often feel like a college ministry having only a brief opportunity to minister to people before they move on. Our unique geographical location in Christ's Kingdom means that we will still need to depend on outside donors for the next two years.

Hello Friends,

Us again? You may be surprised to see a McNeill newsletter again so soon, but here we are. When I wrote barely a month ago, I talked of a blur. We are emerging from the cloud now with a simple end to the year ahead of us. It should begin this coming Friday with a trip for the two of us across the pond, followed by a separation in Frankfurt. Christel heads on to Berlin and I to Moscow. About 2 weeks later we meet in Munich to spend Christmas with Ruth, her boys Joel and Manuel, and her new husband Alessandro. That may look like a challenge to some, but seems simple and straight-forward to us after the past few months.

I had also written about the problems of getting a visa for Russia. In some of their recent publicity, the Russians are talking about eliminating the necessity of a visa for some Western visitors, but if they do plan to change they certainly have an unusual way of preparing for it. For the past decade it has become increasingly difficult and expensive to get a visa to visit Russia, and some of the sources that, years ago, helped me with the process have also dried up. But, in short, my visa arrived last week, thank God, and it

is good for a whole year and multiple entries to the country.

Several of you sent special gifts during the past two months, and that help has been VERY timely with the visa expenses that mounted to over \$700.00 dollars. I could write a short book on the tricks of wringing money from travelers for visas, but I will spare you the pain and grumbling.

To keep this letter short and simple, here is a list of prayer requests.

-for protection as we travel, both overseas and in Europe (Germany and Russia)

-for a fruitful time in what we have to do while separated (Christel visiting with family and friends in Berlin- Jack teaching in Volgograd at a church-based Bible School and contacting a public school in nearby Volzhsky)

-for my elbows and back that will be sorely tested dragging 60 pounds of books to be lugged through airports and train stations on their way to final delivery to a school in Volzhzky in southern Russia

-for a good visit with Ruth and her family in Bavaria. We look forward to seeing them in their new home and even perhaps helping with renovations and settling in.

Thank you for praying for and with us. The last couple of years have had their ups and downs, but God has been faithful, and your encouragement has been one of the ways we have experienced just how faithful He really is.
